## Conflict and Extended Mineral Reporting

Border States is dedicated to assisting customers in completing their supply chain compliance requirements to facilitate a safe, ethical and legal supply chain.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) enforces compliance with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, which requires publicly traded companies to disclose their use of conflict minerals originating from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and surrounding areas. Border States asks manufacturers to complete two forms created by the Responsible Minerals Alliance (RMI):

- The <u>Conflict Minerals Reporting Template</u> to report whether there is a presence of 3TG (tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold).
- The <u>Extended Minerals Reporting Template</u> to report whether there is a presence of extended minerals (cobalt, copper, graphite, lithium, mica and nickel).

While we are not a public company subject to SEC rules, we understand our customers may have reporting requirements. As a wholesale distributor, Border States does not design, test, manufacture, service or control the content of the products we sell. We are made aware of the Conflict and Extended Minerals status of the products we sell by our vendors.
